Stuart Town STAA Meeting 21st November

About 14 people attended the November meeting of the STAA.

The main item of business was the discussion regarding the transfer of the title for the School of Arts Hall back to the Crown.

Kate read through the letter from the department which included the benefits as seen by the department for association.

Many people expressed their concerns about returning the title deeds to the Crown and questioned why this proposal had been brought forward at this time. Kate explained that the letter had come after she had returned the required annual statement from the Department of Lands pertaining to the Crown land which had been "given" to the association several years ago (this is the land behind the RTC).

A discussion then followed regarding the benefits. Kate explained that the main benefit was that the Department of Lands would become responsible for the payment of some of the insurance including public liability insurance. This costs the RTC and the STAA over \$2000 per year. Under the new scheme the STAA would pay a nominal fee of approximately \$110.

The volunteers (a very small band!) spend a lot of time raising this amount of money, money that could be spent on other things.

Richard Eade spoke strongly against the idea of returning the title to the Crown and most of the people attending the meeting agreed with him. A letter was read from John Russell, who was involved with the establishment of the incorporation of the STAA who was also strongly against the idea.

A feeling of distrust was evident regarding the government's offer to take over the title of the School of Arts Hall.

A discussion then ensued regarding the ownership of the land with some people feeling that the hall was built on private land donated to the School of Arts Committee.

The meeting concluded with a general consensus that nothing should be done regarding this matter at the present time. But we will follow up to determine what the title deeds actually say regarding the land that the hall is built on. Also to follow up grants available to pay insurance through the Public Reserves Management Fund.

Michael explained that there was only so much money for Stuart Town but it was our choice on what we wanted to do.

Tim Winters said that the old garage was part of our street scape and that we should save as much of it as possible. Everyone agreed that it would be good to keep the front wall. Mike Ryan stated that he thought the side wall would be strong enough to stand.

The main problem was the wall that had fallen down. This needs to be replaced some way but probably not as it was as this would be very expensive.

So, Michael and Mike are going to develop a few options and liaise with Andrew, the neighbour and present the alternatives to us after Christmas.

I asked could it be cleaned up for Easter and that seems to be on the agenda. All in all it was a very successful meeting with everyone happy with the direction that is being taken.

NO BAKE CHOCOLATE FUDGE FRUIT CAKE

This is in the No Bake section of the Recipe File and it is so nice I need to hide it or it disappears almost immediately. It is very rich, so I cut it into small squares. That also makes the troops feel better because they can come back for seconds, and they don't realise they're only getting a half serve.

I use whatever biscuits are on sale. I've been buying Oreos from NQR lately, but Coles and Woolworths often have biscuits on sale - use whatever you can get at the cheapest price. I also only use generic cream cheese, it's a fraction of the price of Philadelphia cream cheese and just as good. Sometimes you can get Philly on sale at NQR so if you shop there, keep an eye open and stock up.

Ingredients:

2 pkts chocolate cream biscuits
125g cream cheese
1 egg
1 cup mixed fruit
125g milk chocolate
1 teaspoon butter
1 tablespoon water

Method:

Split 1 packet of biscuits in half. Crush the other packet in a food processor or with a rolling pin. In a large bowl mix crushed biscuits, cream cheese, egg, mixed fruit and half the chocolate that has been melted. Line a 20cm square cake tin with half the split biscuits. Spread the chocolate fruit mixture over the biscuits. Place the remaining split biscuits on top of the fruit mixture. Melt remaining chocolate with butter and water, mixing well. Drizzle over the top and in between the biscuits. Cover with foil or plastic wrap and refrigerate for at least 4 hours until set. Slice into fingers to serve.
