"Stuart Town Health Committee"

On the 29th March a small gathering of the past "Stuart Town Health Committee" met at the Stuart Town Rural Transaction Centre for a delicious luncheon organized by Margaret Patterson, assisted by her daughter Kerrie and Sue Francis.

Dr John Hoskin, Ex Matron of Bindawalla Hospital Judith Scott, Nurses Judi Francis, Eris Thorpe and Wendy Campbell and Allie Choc Ching from the District Hospital were all present.

Just a brief history on the Stuart Town Health Committee.

In 1975 Dr John Hoskin, his wife Lesley and their family Rosalind, Sarah and Richard

purchased a property called "Allambie" and made their home in Stuart Town. In 1976 a public meeting was called to discuss a part time medical/physiotherapy practice in the village. This meeting had an attendance of fifty five interested people. Dr Hoskin, in response to the request said there was a need especially for the aged and for those without ready available transport and expressed a willingness to run a part time medical practice.



A committee was formed and the original Clinic room in the School of Arts Hall was made available to rent. Much assistance was given, with donation of equipment by the Wellington hospital. The Practise was opened on May 9th 1977 and to be opened each Monday afternoon 1.30 pm to coincide with Boehmes Hall seniors' day.

The services available over the period John was here included Cancer clinics, Blood banks, Hydatis Awareness Campaign, Testing for organic Phosphate Poisoning and an Oxy-viva was purchased with the help of donations from various organizations. In 1981 tragedy struck the Hoskin family when they lost Lesley. Stuart Town was sad to have the family move on but Dr Gareth Thomas followed in John's footsteps and it was while Gareth was here operating on Monday afternoons that part of the Rural Transaction Centre was built, the surgery was updated and the waiting room in the RTC was much more comfortable.

After Gareth left to further his career Dr Sandra Mendel from Orange became our local doctor.

Unfortunately we are without a doctor now, but Dr Merle from Wellington filled in for awhile but her commitments in Wellington became too much for her to keep up her visits in Stuart Town. We are now lucky to have two days a year when nurses come out from Wellington to

hold a health clinic in the hall.
