# Clr Rod Buhr Named Wellington's Mayor for Second Term

Wellington Council has re-elected Rod Buhr as Mayor for the next term. Cr Buhr was elected to

Wellington's leading role at Council's Ordinary meeting held 25 September.Cr David Grant was also re-elected as Deputy Mayor.

A busy year for Council, Cr Buhr is keen to continue delivering a clear vision for the future, with a focused view on the year ahead.

"I would like to thank my fellow Councillors for their confidence in me and I will aim to deliver with them the best outcomes into the future," Cr Buhr said.

"The Councillors and staff have supported me as Mayor over the last 12 months and I will rely on this continued support over the next year."

"Wellington Council has worked collaboratively over the last year to forge the changes necessary to secure opportunities into the future and I aim to continue that approach to build on what we have already achieved."







Positive plans move forward for upgrade and improvement works in Wellington A Voluntary Planning Agreement has been negotiated between Wellington Council and Cobbora Holding Company Pty Ltd to which Council has given an "inprinciple" agreement.

The Voluntary Planning Agreement is in two parts based on infrastructure provision and on contributions made by the developer.

The first set of infrastructure improvement would be undertaken prior to construction commencing and includes the upgrade and sealing of the Cobbora Road (MR353) with upgrade and sealing works to an estimated value of \$4.6 million have been agreed.

Funding for this work would be triggered by receipt by Cobbora Holding Company Pty Ltd of both State and Federal approval for the project. This funding is not tied to project commencement.

Mayor for Wellington Councillor Rod Buhr says, "This is great news for our Local Government Area."

In addition, further works will also include \$261,282.57 for the design and associated costs for Wellington Council to improve and widen the approaches to Saxa Creek Bridge.

Councillor Buhr says, "The upgrading of Cobbora Road has been a long sought after goal for Wellington Council, and one which has the potential to enable Council to re-direct road funding to other local road priorities."

The second part of the Voluntary Planning Agreement comes into effect once construction at the mine site commences and would include contributions to Wellington Council of \$100,000 per year during the construction phase and a minimum of \$60,000 per year during the mines operational phase. These contributions would be for community benefit and public purpose. Councillor Buhr says, "This is very positive news for our Local Government Area and a significant step forward in the upgrades and improvements to our local road infrastructure and positive financial flow on benefits to our region. We anticipate a positive impact on the local economy with an enhanced transport route and a potential

new transport corridor emerging."

## Chicken with Sugar Snap Peas & Spring Herbs

- 1 cup reduced-sodium chicken broth
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- Freshly ground pepper to taste
- 2 teaspoons plus 1 tablespoon flour, divided
- 1 pound thin-sliced chicken breast cutlets
- 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil
- 1. 8 ounces sugar snap peas, cut in half (2 cups) Whisk broth, mustard, salt, pepper and 2 teaspoons flour in a small bowl until smooth.
- 2. Sprinkle both sides of the chicken with the remaining 1 tablespoon flour. Heat oil in a large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Cook the chicken in two batches, adjusting heat as necessary to prevent burning, until golden, about 2 minutes per side. Transfer the chicken to a plate; tent with foil to keep warm.
- 3. Stir the broth mixture and add to the pan along with snap peas, artichoke hearts and sprouted beans (if using). Bring to a simmer, stirring constantly. Reduce heat to maintain a gentle simmer and cook until the snap peas are tender-crisp, 3 to 5 minutes.
- 4. Return the chicken to the pan, nestling it into the vegetables, and simmer until heated through, 1 to 2 minutes. Remove from heat; stir in herbs and vinegar.
